

## COM Enrollment Patterns: Bay Area Students Outside Marin County

This report is to aid in achieving COM's strategic planning goal of increasing enrollment. The following tables detail the COM enrollment patterns of San Francisco Bay Area students residing outside Marin County between Fall 2015 and Spring 2017. This determination is based on "primary residence city" as reported in COM's Data Enterprise System (Banner). Statistics are descriptive and exclude summer terms.

**Overall:** Approximately 800 students who live in the 9-county Bay Area outside of Marin enroll at COM each semester, from Fall 2015 through Spring 2017. Approximately 58% live in Sonoma or Contra Costa Counties. Another 20% come from San Francisco.

Enrollment at COM from Contra Costa and San Francisco Counties has been relatively flat. Enrollment from the rest of the counties has declined. Solano County enrollment has dropped the most (from 93 students to 57), more than double that of any other Bay Area County. Cities with the largest draw include San Francisco, Petaluma and Santa Rosa (in Sonoma County), Richmond (in Contra Costa), and Vallejo (in Solano County). Of these cities, enrollment from Petaluma and Vallejo has declined.

- Table 1 shows the enrollment by term for the 17%-18% of COM students from the Bay Area. One-third were from Sonoma County; one-quarter from Contra Costa; and 20% from San Francisco.
- Student enrollment from Solano County declined since Fall 2015.
- The Bay Area cities averaging 50 or more students each term include San Francisco, Petaluma, Santa Rosa, Richmond and Vallejo, though enrollment from Vallejo dropped to 43 in Spring 2017 (Tables 2a-2d).

### Programs and Courses

- The majors with the highest enrollment were Registered Nursing, Art, Business Administration-Transfer, and Biology (Table 3).
- The programs with the largest number of course enrollments include Nursing, Math, English and Biology (Table 4).
- Courses with more than 100 enrollments in the 2-year period include English 150 and 151; NE 90 (Nursing); Math 103; Psychology 110; and Biology 110, 120 and 110L (lab). See Table 5.
- Students from Contra Costa, Solano, and San Francisco enrolled in more courses per term than those from other counties (Table 6).
- Students from Napa, Santa Clara, Solano, and Sonoma counties were the most likely to enroll at courses at the IVC campus, though the numbers from Napa and Santa Clara counties were small (Tables 7a-7h).

### Demographics, Attendance, Financial Aid and Enrollment Status

- Students from Contra Costa, San Francisco, and Solano counties (those with the highest number of students enrolled) were more likely than those from other counties to have attended COM for more than one term during the 2-year period examined (Table 8).

- Contra Costa and Solano counties sent far larger proportions of Hispanic students than other counties (Table 10).
- Contra Costa and Napa counties sent the largest proportion of students under 24 (Table 11), though the number of enrollments from Napa was small.
- More students from Contra Costa and Solano than from other counties were financial aid recipients, though the percentage in Solano County has decreased slightly (Table 12).
- Of the counties with the largest enrollment—Sonoma, San Francisco, Contra Costa, Alameda and Solano—Alameda and Sonoma counties had the highest proportion of students with "New Transfer" status (Table 1). The largest proportion of new first-time students were from Contra Costa.
